If they can go into cost engineering and then be able to acquire the extra knowledge then they will

**Engr. Battah:** Any engineer can do it. But you see the most important thing is that you will be able to get more knowledge to practice the discipline even in the cost engineering sector. It is basically about projects and projects have divers dimension of specialty. It is multidimensional. When you get the first basic training you will be able to apply it across board.
